VINTAGE NOTE

The 2015 Washington state harvest will go down in history as the vintage where parts of the state persevered above irrigation restrictions, several 100-degree days, and a few late-season regional wildfires that spared growers from any problems. It will also be noted as the year with a record surge in growing degree days, a harvest that started early and ended by mid-October, and a bounty that surpassed even the 227,000-ton record set during the 2014 Washington harvest. Fruit flavors from this harvest are concentrated and intense, with moderate berry size, excellent phenolic ripeness and balanced acidity.

WALLA WALLA AVA

41% Browne Family Estate Vineyard, 6% Blue Mountain Vineyard: Known for wines with great balance of acids and sugars and concentrated, well-pronounced flavor.

YAKIMA VALLEY AVA

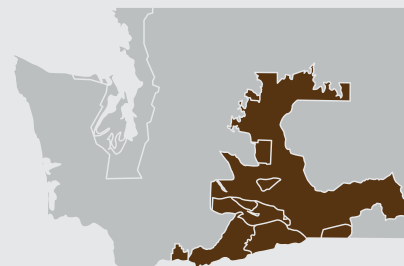
20% Blackrock Vineyard, 3% Willard: Known for wines with naturally bright acidity and fruity characteristics.

COLUMBIA VALLEY AVA

8% various vineyards, 7% Mirage, 5% Roosevelt Known for its many and varied microclimates (cool, warm, windy, hilly, flat), Columbia Valley is the umbrella AVA under which many of the state's sub-AVAs fall.

RED MOUNTAIN AVA

8% Taylor Mag, 2% Klipsun Vineyard: Named for its red grasses, the warmest AVA in Washington known for its diversity of vineyards and uniqueness of its terroir.
